Message from the Head of the Overseas Department
December 26, Tenrikyo 169

I would like to commend each of you for your daily dedication in each of your concurrent positions.

With the Shinbashira as the core, the December Monthly service was duly conducted befitting the last monthly service that concludes the 169th year of the Teaching, the year of Oyasama's anniversary. The Oyasato was bustling with returning followers.

In his prayer, the Shinbashira reflected upon the year of Oyasama's anniversary and expressed his gratitude for the blessings that allowed the Oyasato to have a lively atmosphere with many people returning to Jiba throughout the year.

He then referred to all church head ministers who attended one of this year's Monthly Services in a designated area next to the Inner Sanctuary so that they can pay respects to the Kagura Service before their very eyes and bring a greater sense of joy and enthusiasm into their minds. The Shinbashira prayed that we could translate such joy and enthusiasm into the monthly service at each local church in order that the everlasting truth of a church name would flourish. He then made a resolution to reflect upon our progress, set ourselves a new goal, and take steps along the path of responding to the intention of the Parent with a fresh mind in embarking on the upcoming new year.

Following the Service, Honbu-in Reverend Akio Shikao gave the sermon.

He first talked about the year of Oyasama's anniversary with many people returning to Jiba throughout the year, regardless of whether they are followers of the path or not.

He then shared with the listeners his experiences and thoughts about the "3rd Nara Prefecture Interfaith Forum" that was held at the South Right Wing 2 in September. He said that Tenrikyo has no commandment stating that "we must not do this or that." Rather, the followers of the path are required to have a sense of mission and seek for "what we must do" in accord with the teachings of Oyasama. He explained that it is very difficult to maintain such attitude of faith, but it is a highly sophisticated way of living as human beings. He also referred to the Life of Oyasama, Foundress of Tenrikyo that falls fifty years after its publication.

Quoting from the second Shinbashira, he went on to say, "The Divine Model of Oyasama is the essence of our faith. In order to apply the Divine Model to our lives, we can also refer to the Honseki's way of living."

He concluded his sermon by saying, "Let us perform what we must do with our utmost sincerity in advancing our steps toward the next mile stone."

Needless-to-say, as we are concluding the year, the Tenrikyo Administrative Headquarters will also complete this year's tasks tomorrow. Regarding the Tenrikyo Overseas Department, some staff members will be serving in the office during the end of the year.

Dendocho December Monthly Service Sermon

Reverend Eric Takata

(Tenrikyo McCully Church)



Good morning everyone, I am sure that God the Parent, Oyasama, and our predecessors are very pleased with our performance and our presence here today. My name is Eric Takata, Reverend of Tenrikyo McCully Church. Today, I was asked to deliver this month's sermon. Before I begin, I would like to thank Rev. Motoko Iwata, for translating this sermon. Thank you very much. Now, may I please have your kind attention, thank you.

This month, December 2006, closes the 120th Anniversary of Oyasama. I think we can all reflect on this anniversary year as a positive one! Many of us were able to return to Ojiba and enjoy the feeling of returning home and feeling the presence of Oyasama's motherly warmth. I can only sense that God the Parent and Oyasama were very pleased for our concerted effort

and unity in mind to advance in single-hearted salvation, by returning with many of our brothers and sisters to give thanks and appreciation for all the blessings we have each day.

In the beginning of the Ofudesaki and the beginning of the song for the Teodori, Yorozuyo, it quotes, "Looking all over the world and through all ages, I find no one who has understood My heart. So should it be, for I have never taught it to you. It is natural that you know nothing. This time I, God, revealing Myself to the fore, Teach you all the Truth in detail."

When I first read this, it put a big smile on my face. It was very refreshing to hear such honest words from God the Parent. God the Parent teaches us all the Truth in detail constantly, in every moment of the day. It is in front of our very eyes. Because we cannot or are not able to understand the Truth in detail, it becomes difficult to follow this Tenrikyo path. I was once taught by my father that anything you try to do in life that you do not know is difficult, but the things that you do know are easy. Like in this religion, if you don't know the Teachings, this path has many difficulties, and when we become more aware of our Parent's intention and start to understand the Tenrikyo teaching, it becomes easier.

We then find the truth and receive joy in knowing this teaching.

When the time Oyasama became the “Living Shrine of God the Parent,” She, too, underwent a period of time with God the Parent, instructing Her the Divine Truth in detail. I would think, like anyone, She would have difficulties at first in accepting and understanding the intention of God the Parent. For fifty years, Oyasama went through many difficulties and taught our predecessors the Divine Truth of Tenrikyo. Oyasama, as our Divine Model, taught us, Yoboku, the path to follow where we may have less difficulties in growing spiritually. It is I that must commit from my heart to follow the intention of the Parent, for I may spiritually grow in my salvation work.

In the Instruction Two, there is a part from the Kakisage, “The mind of saving others is the real truth of sincerity alone, and by this truth of saving others you are saved.” This is what God the Parent and Oyasama wants us to have, a sincere heart in saving others. As we study more in the Doctrine of Tenrikyo and the Life of Oyasama, we gradually understand the

Divine Truth of Tenrikyo. We must put our time and efforts in trying to gain spiritual growth. With a sincere heart and leaning on our Parent, we will surely mature in saving others.

I know God the Parent and Oyasama are guiding me to mature spiritually each day. I know by taking this path, that I must put my effort in understanding the “intention of the Parent,” which is to help your fellow man and to reach the Joyous Life.

Like Oyasama, when the portals opened and She stepped out to save mankind, She, as the Parent, taught us the Truth of the Origin in detail. Are we ready to open our own portals and save mankind? The Instruction Two was given for the preparation of the 120th Anniversary, but I feel we can use this Instruction Two until we receive the new Instruction. Until the next anniversary, I will try to have a stronger commitment in working on my spiritual growth.

HUGS CHRISTMAS PARTY




