The Joyous Life

Good Morning! Mina sama ohaiyo gozai masu!

First of all, I would like to thank Reverend Ichise for translating today's sermon for me. I would also like to thank Mihama Sensei who will be doing the simultaneous interpretation for me.

Although it is raining heavily outside on this Sunday Morning, I still consider this a beautiful day, and I will tell you why.

Today is a beautiful Sunday because all of you here have received the blessings of God the Parent, and are safe and dry here in church. The air here is filled with love and joyousness because of your sincere presence.

The last month of the year is always very busy for most of us... many of us are preparing for the New Year.

I thank you very much for coming to the Hawaii Tenrikyo Mission Headquarters monthly service for this month of December.

Last year, in early December, Bishop Hamada called me at my home and assigned me to today's sermon which was to include the Doctrine of Tenrikyo, Chapter 10, The Joyous Life.

This was the very last chapter of the doctrine.

At this time I thought to myself, Doctrine, Chapter 10, The Joyous Life...wow what an honor and I have a whole year to prepare! With a whole year to prepare, this better be a good sermon, I thought! I graciously accepted my assignment and here I am.

Time flies by so fast! A year has already gone by!

So sit back and relax... and please listen to this very important sermon from Chapter 10 of our Doctrine of Tenrikyo.

The Doctrine of Tenrikyo is a book which has been compiled at the Tenrikyo Church Headquarters based on the Scriptures: the Ofudesaki, the Mikagura-uta, and the Osashizu.

This book of the Tenrikyo Doctrine was

authorized by the former Shinbashira, Shozen Nakayama on October 26, 1949
The Osashizu, June 1, 1889 states:

“With human beings, the body is a thing borrowed from God. the mind alone is yours”

This is a very important verse which I will be referring to throughout my sermon.

Our minds are unique from all others, it is different from everyone else's. God the Parent has blessed you with the ability to choose right from wrong, the truth from untruth.

Why were we created?

“HUMAN BEINGS WERE CREATED BY GOD THE PARENT,

WHOSE DESIRE IN THE CREATION WAS TO SEE THE JOYOUS LIFE

OF MANKIND ... AND...THUS TO SHARE IN THAT JOY. “

To bring this intent of God the Parent into realization, is the significance of human life and the ultimate goal of mankind! A bright and spirited mind is a joyous mind. By living each day with this joyous mind, we shall find true happiness and shall feel that life is indeed worth living. On the other hand...If our minds are not spirited, but depressed, we shall not be in accord with the mind of God

the Parent. No matter how long we continue our faith, a depressed mind will only lead to unhappiness. As we all know, a depressed mind will also lead our bodies to dysfunction with sickness.

I recall Bishop Hamada in one of his sermons said:

Tenrikyo is unique from Christian religions because we do not have to die to attain the Joyous life.

This to me was a very profound statement by our Bishop which made me ponder deeply about heaven and hell.

In other words, Christian religions relates to death as to their next step towards Heaven or Hell. The Christian society ingrains our thoughts with heaven and hell.

By being good, and only after you die, you will arrive at heaven. A place where there are angels with wings and harps, and peacefulness.

On the other side of the coin, if you were bad and when you die, you will go to hell, deep down into the fires of the center of earth.

KOKORO SHIDAI (ACCORDING TO THE STATE OF MIND)

Human beings are endowed with the freedom to live as free and responsible beings. The state of one's mind determines the way one receives God the Parents blessings.

In Tenrikyo... we have two choices...to be good or to be bad... which means we

have the freedom of choosing.

If we all live happily with a sincere mind to help others in need... If our frame of mind is with good thoughts and because of our sincere minds, we are liked by others and pass on our happy thoughts to others around us...then it is only natural that we all will be happy! Isn't this the Joyous Life that we are all seeking? A life where we are all happy with what we are doing, and a frame of mind to keep us happy?

In other words, we can be alive and enjoy a Joyous Life. Isn't this wonderful! We can enjoy the joyous life right here! We all can enjoy this joy right now! Look at the person sitting to your right or left, do you see a smiling face? If you don't, try smiling at this person! If the other person sitting next to you smiles back...this is the beginning. You and this person have entered into what the joyous life is all about! If we keep on smiling and others begin to smile, soon after more people will begin to smile. This is contagious! Keep smiling! I think that unconsciously, we are all waiting to become happy... to feel the joy that surrounds us!

So wake up the person next to you and smile! Smile long enough so that this person will respond back to you. Maybe... pretty soon...we will all be smiling and enjoying our neighbors company.

We must remember that there are some rules that we must follow to avoid being

unhappy... but these are simple and good rules to benefit you and every person around you.

These are the rules of mental dusts:

1. MISERLINESS
2. COVETOUSNESS
3. HATRED
4. SELF-LOVE
5. GRUDGE-BEARING
6. ANGER
7. GREED
8. ARROGANCE

We should also watch out for FALSEHOOD and FLATTERY.

We must remember these mental dusts and try to avoid them in our daily lives, as they are the causes for sickness and unhappiness.

Happiness or Joyousness is primarily dependent on how we handle these mental dusts. Because we are human with the ability to choose right from wrong, we sometimes unintentionally enter into the world of mental dusts.

Don't we all get angry sometimes? Or even hold a grudge only to later find that we forgot what we were mad about?

With God the Parent's blessings, we have the ability to "sweep away" these dusts on a daily basis through prayer, hinokishin and sincerity. We have to remember that dusts will fall upon us on a daily basis and these dusts must be "cleaned: or "swept away" with the tools given to us by God the Parent

It is like cleaning a shiny dinner table in the kitchen, only to find a thin layer of dust on it the very next day. If we don't clean this table everyday, the fine dust will become thicker and thicker as time goes by.

The thicker the dust, the harder it will be to "clean" or "sweep away" this dust.

IN SUMMARY....

God the Parent appeared into this world through our Oyasama and taught us the intent of creation... WHICH WAS TO SEE THE JOYOUS LIFE OF MANKIND AND THUS SHARE IN THAT JOY.

God the Parent taught us everything concerning the path of the single hearted salvation. He then hastened the Salvation of mankind by teaching us the Salvation Service, and bestowing to us the Sazuke of Breath and the Sazuke of hand dance.

We were also taught the Truth of Origin, which explains how we were created. Also to pray to God the Parent by calling out the name, TENRI ONO MIKOTO!

It was through our Foundress, Miki Nakayama that we were taught God the Parents teachings, and to walk the single hearted path towards the Joyous World.

It was through our Foundress or Oyasama we have come to understand that our bodies are a thing lent, a thing borrowed from God the Parent, and upon understanding how blessings are received, we "sweep away" the dusts and endeavor in the construction of our minds.

The doctrine also states:

In our path to spiritual maturity, we come across days of winds and rains.

These are the days in which we settle our minds with Tanno and strive in hinokishin. Then the mind of true sincerity that we have attained will spread its influence to others and one person's path will become the path for many.

Followers of the path will desire to become a yoboku and will receive the truth of Sazuke, as they strive in single hearted salvation and convey to others the truth of salvation... they will become Pioneers of the Path. Instances of marvelous salvation will follow one after another and the souls of mankind will be regenerated in rapid succession. Then...one day when we come to live in perfect harmony, our true happiness and peace long awaited by God the Parent. This world is the goal of our path.

The last phrase of our Doctrine reads:

**What do you think of this way?
This is the true way to bring peace
on this earth.**

In Japan it is common for families to greet the new year over a bowl of soba. So you can imagine how happy I was to find this recipe online! The nutritional information shared by all recipes.com per serving was Calories: 295. Total Fat: 4.8g and

Cholesterol: 46mg. The suggested drink for the fine diner is Riesling wine or for the more simple diner, just a glass of good ole beer! Enjoy and celebrate a very prosperous new year!

Yakisoba Chicken

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 2 tablespoons chile paste
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breast, cut into 1 inch cubes
- 1/2 cup shoyu
- 1 onion, sliced lengthwise into eighths
- 1/2 medium head cabbage, coarsely chopped
- 2 carrots, coarsely chopped
- 8 ounces soba noodles, cooked and drained

Directions

In a large skillet combine sesame oil, canola oil and chili paste. Stir fry 30 seconds. Add garlic and stir fry an additional 30 seconds. Add chicken and 1/4 cup of the shoyu and stir fry until chicken is no longer pink. Remove mixture from pan, set aside and keep warm. In the emptied pan combine the onion, cabbage and carrots. Stir fry until cabbage begins to wilt. Stir in the remaining soy sauce, cooked noodles and the chicken mixture to pan and mix to blend. Serve on a festive platter.
