A Brief History of 60 years of the Path in Hawaii

In July, two months after Dendocho's 40th Anniversary Service was conducted on May 14, 1994, the adjacent two parcels of land were put up for sale. Bishop Nagao immediately notified Rev. Masahiko Iburi, head of the Overseas Mission Department about it. It was decided, by the Shinbashira's decision, that the Church Headquarters would pay the entire amount of \$880,000 and that the Hawaii diocese would repay them by the 110th Anniversary of Oyasama. Due to this miraculous blessing, coinciding with the 40th Anniversary, Dendocho's property became 50% larger to a total of 62,000 sq. ft. (approximately 700 *tsubo*).

Rev. Yoshiharu Yoshikawa, who had been installed as the 6th bishop, commenced the construction of Rainbow Hale in 1988, purporting it as a nurturing facility of the youth. On April 10, 1999, the Opening Ceremony was conducted following Dendocho's April Monthly Service. In his prayer of the Monthly Service, Bishop Yoshikawa addressed,

“With the profound parental heart of the Church Headquarters and the sincere support from the Hawaii diocese, the long-desired construction at the adjacent property has been completed. Thus, following today’s Monthly Service, we will conduct the Opening Ceremony and make the best use of the facility for the nurturing of the youth, who will carry on the path in the next generation.” Rev. Masahiko Iburi at the closing of his sermon said, “The nurturing facility of the youth will be opened today. It is a facility for Hawaii’s promising future. I am honored to be able to participate with you in the tape-cutting ceremony.”

Following the Monthly Service, the service performers in their service attires and the congregation gathered in front of the newly-constructed building. Rev. Iburi, with a pair of scissors, cut the red-and-white tape that was placed in front of the entrance. As Bishop Yoshikawa led Rev. Iburi into the facility, everyone followed and observed the facility.

Upon the request for suggestions on a simple but friendly name for the facility, the name “Rainbow Hale” was chosen from the various submissions.

September Monthly Service Prayer

Together with all present, I sincerely pray that You bless us so.

Mission HQ September Monthly Service Sermon

Mrs. Chiyo Akemoto *Spouse of Former Head Minister of Paradise Church*

Good Morning. We have just completed the September monthly service here at Mission Headquarters, in high spirits, and I think we were able to bring joy to God the Parent and Oyasama.

Having lived for these many years I still feel I have yet to mature spiritually, but, as if in an attempt to awaken myself, I have obediently accepted this task at this time. May I please have your kind attention.

First, I feel that I need to give my thanks to everyone here, though it may not be the most appropriate time. Last month, August 30th, we held the Installation Service of the second head minister of Paradise Church. I would like to thank all of you for your guidance and encouragement.

The first head minister, passed away for rebirth at home without any suffering after entrusting everything to the second head minister. He was continuously reflecting and trying to fix his bad habit of speaking loudly and roughly, and I thank all of you for putting up with it for such a long time, using tanno and not being angry. Even though all of you were probably busy, I sincerely thank you for coming to bid him farewell.

Upon asking about the topic for this sermon, the bishop replied that I have many seeds. After arriving in Hawai'i and living here for 56 years, there are indeed many things I could talk about... actually too many



things, and I, not having organizational skills, only held my head in despair in preparation for today. But, my husband had told me that it would be fine, and it is my belief that I have received his help.

There was an unforgettable large event that took place last year on Friday, June 14 at 10:30am.

At the foot of Diamond Head, shining green, having been washed from the morning rain, with the smell of Hawai'i being carried in the wind, the Shinbashira had arrived. After praying to the three shrines, just at the time he was to give his talk, the Shinbashira said in a gentle voice, "You may remain standing"

The head minister replied, "Thank you very much. Thank you for allowing me to remain standing, though it is normally rude" to which he unnecessarily added, "I am a strange person, so the illness I received is also strange." The tension

in the room, created by the presence of important people in the entourage such as Reverend Yamazawa, Reverend Miyamori, led by Bishop Yamanaka, was broken up by everyone's laughter, but I broke into a cold sweat.

With assistance from the Shuto Grand Church head minister, and the head minister of our upper church, we were able to get through this event. I believe it was also the courtesy of everyone in Hawai'i that this event had materialized. I thank you very much. This was the time, where my husband had developed early stage of cancer in his tailbone, and was not able to sit down because of the pain. We also had no idea what was proper, or what had to be done to prepare for this event. We had very few followers, and was a small church, but we were overjoyed that the successor and his wife had been blessed with a son, so we moved forward spiritedly thinking this event wouldn't happen again. Even in illness, my husband was spirited, rebuilding the crest (*mon*) that was carved by our second-son years ago, into a brand new larger crest, and began to do repairs to the stairs, as well as other places. Daniel also started to paint church with his friends, and after a while, everything became nice.

In May, on the day we would welcome the new bishop and his wife, my husband developed a small fever on the bus ride to Mission Headquarters, so he laid down until the time had come to welcome them.

After the greetings, we went home, without

participating in taking of the commemorative picture, and eventually did not attend the May Monthly Service either. We fervently prayed to God the Parent and Oyasama, and received the Sazuke. During that time, things began to turn around. I felt deeply grateful.

In June, during the installation service for the bishop and the monthly service the next day, he was able to perform the hand dance for the 1st half, it was a big blessing. After this, Bishop Yamanaka and his wife would come to do the Sazuke for the Head Minister. I was happy that we received such warm and caring actions, and I sincerely thank you from my heart.

The predecessor to Paradise Church was Diamond Church a subordinate church of Taiheiyo Church.

The name "Paradise" was received during the three year, one-thousand day season of the 80th Anniversary of Oyasama, when we became a mission station. The past head minister of Taiheiyo Church, Reverend Robert Mikuni, who had taken care of us in great lengths, gave us this name, and the first bishop of Mission Headquarters, Bishop Inoue, was overjoyed upon this, therefore, this name is a very important name. After receiving a command from the previous Head Minister of Shuto Grand Church, Reverend Isao Nishiura, previous head minister of Marifu Branch Church and Shuto Grand Church staff minister, though suffering from an illness that rendered him unable to eat, came down together with his wife to solicit our assistance.

However difficult you think matters to be, you need not worry. Tsukihi takes charge. Ofudesaki XII:71

All of you in the the world, look forward to the path ahead. If only the regret of God is all cleared away...

Before Reverend Nishiura left Japan, he did the prayer service, and opened the Ofudesaki, and read these two verses. It struck a chord in his heart, and through his illness, was able to come and receive the consent of all of us including Daniel. It was a great relief for Reverend Nishiura and his wife. The head minister of the Grand Church, after completing the enshrinement ceremony, said, “This is the first time having this feeling,” as he took my husband’s hand and expressed these words of gratitude with tears in his eyes. These words became my treasure and enabled me to work hard for the past fifteen years.

At that time, Reverend Iburi, the Director-in-chief of Administrative Affairs, came to visit with Bishop Yoshikawa, I will never forget his words of encouragement, “Like your name ‘Paradise,’ become a church that is cheerful and energetic, build a foundation and sprinkle the fragrance of Oyasama, not just Honolulu, nor O`ahu, but everywhere.”

Hurriedly without any time to even collect our thoughts, on August 28, 1999, in the presence of five upper church head ministers, with the urging of the Parent, we performed

our Installation Service. It was just as our upper church Head Minister had stated, that this was the day God the Parent waited for.

Both us had come to Hawai`i, not for missionary work, but simply as followers of the church, to earn and send monetary offerings to our upper church, as a form of spiritual filial piety, so they may purchase land and a structure. Fortunately, my husband was technically a third-generation Japanese-American in Hawai`i, and was able to work immediately. Monthly, we would send our offerings through mail, call our upper church on the morning of their monthly service, and give our prayer vocally, and in this way, we connect our hearts to our spiritual parent.

My husband who lamented retiring from his job to become head minister, followed the words of Bishop Hamada, and began to attend the morning service. We did morning service before 3:30am, and went out after breakfast, though it was still dark. As I counted the stars, I chased after my husband, with my slow feet, who walked at a quick pace in front of me. The people of Hawai`i are early risers. My husband smiled when one man said to him, “wait for your wife.”

We became acquainted with the joggers, the people walking their dogs, the newspaper delivery people, and the bus drivers. It is all wonderful memories, and now, by myself I continue to come and worship, at a little later time.

If we took one step out of the church, we were sprinkling the fragrance. Even if it rained, we did not use the car, except in

special situations. After the morning service at Mission Headquarters, we would only travel to where we could by bus. We also had unfortunate incidences such as losing a follower due to heart failure, just as he gained the ability to walk again after being confined to a wheel-chair for many years, become a yoboku and began to come to church spiritedly.

In the seasonal time of Oyasama's 120th Anniversary, my husband developed rectal cancer, and in his pain, he continued to attend service, while Bishop Hamada had performed the Sazuke on him. As if in preparation for his death, he returned to Jiba, in his thin, emaciated body. Under the protection of God the Parent and Oyasama, he returned safely to Hawai'i. After being persuaded by Bishop Hamada and his wife, he allowed Daniel to take him to Queen's Hospital, and was to receive surgery. It was July. Daniel returned to Jiba to participate in the International Hinokishin Corps, and apparently prayed to God the Parent and Oyasama during that time. When removed, the cancer was big and round, and was at stage three. Yet, because he would not be transitioned, or receive chemotherapy or medicine of any type, it didn't serve any purpose to remain at the hospital, so he was discharged. While I was thinking about how he would climb our staircase of thirteen steps, he climbed the stairs on his own, and prayed in the worship hall with his own strength. Daniel had returned home at that time, and the three of us started the morning service prayer. The

doctor was also very surprised of his quick recovery. For the August monthly service at Mission Headquarters, in order to continue his recovery, the bishop put him back into the Service performance roster. He carried out his assignment of male singer in the first half without any problems. In October, the former Shinbashira visited Shuto Grand Church, and my husband was able to return to Jiba, attend the Autumn Grand Service, visit the upper churches, and made a resolution that he would be fine to pass away for rebirth at any time, thus prepared the proper documents for the doctor.

It was at this time when my husband became healthy, and Daniel returned to Jiba for two years to sow seeds of sincerity. In February, of the year the Women's Association was celebrating their 100th Anniversary, I discovered I had uterine cancer. I entered the hospital on the afternoon of my surgery and was discharged at noon the following day. During this time Rumi Miyauchi has taken care of me. Thank you very much for doing so. The doctor was surprised at how quickly I recovered, without pain, and without medicine or chemotherapy. The next day was the monthly service at the Mission Headquarters, and Mrs. Hamada guided me to a room where I was to rest, but Reverend Nishimura exclaimed that there was no one to play the shoko for gagaku, so I hurriedly borrowed a kyofuku robe, and performed. Reverend Nishimura did not know that I just had surgery for my cancer the day before. I was able to return to Jiba in April for the

Women's Association Convention, and I gave my thanks with tears streaming. Every morning Mrs. Hamada performed the Sazuke on me. The head of Overseas department, Reverend Miyamori, who happened to be there, Reverend Hironaga the Shuto dormitory director, and Rumi also performed the Sazuke. Also with the sincerity of the people of Paradise Church, as well as the many people around, I have received a great blessing from God the Parent and Oyasama.

My husband and I had lived, not completely knowing the teachings, but faithfully following, obediently marrying together soon after entering the faith, hurriedly coming to Hawai'i, becoming friends with everyone while becoming indebted to you all for fifty-six years. Our four children successfully

became Yoboku, and both our parents in Hawai'i and in Japan also became Yoboku. Daniel has become the next head minister and been working hard towards the 130th Anniversary with his wife. This happy life, I believe, is just as the parents said, to just obediently serve and God the Parent and Oyasama will reward you greatly.

I will continue to walk firmly on this path. With the last words of my husband saying, "I am sorry for not being able to help," and my response, "Thank you for your hard work, all this time," held in my heart, I will go along and do my best together with the new head minister and his wife.

Thank you very much for your patience in this long sermon about my personal matters which may have been difficult to listen to.

The Hungry Reporter

I've always been interested in experimenting with using liquid smoke flavoring. I've posted a slow-cooker pork roast using liquid smoke and it turned out delicious. I love pork chops so when I saw this recipe I just had to share it. I know this recipe suggests using a Barbeque grill but it can also be cooked on the stove or grilled in the oven until done. I hope you enjoy this recipe!

Smokey Grilled Pork Chops

Ingredients:

- 1 Tbsp Seasoned Salt (such as LAWRY'S®)
- 1 tsp Ground Black Pepper
- 1 Tbsp Garlic Powder
- 1 Tbsp Onion Powder
- 1 Tbsp Ground Paprika
- 2 tsp Worcestershire Sauce
- 1 tsp liquid smoke flavoring
- 4 Bone-in Pork Chops (1/2 to 3/4 inch thick)



Directions:

1. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium heat, and lightly oil the grate.
2. In a bowl, mix together the seasoned salt, black pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, paprika, Worcestershire sauce, and smoke flavoring until thoroughly combined. Rinse pork chops, and sprinkle the wet chops on both sides with the spice mixture. With your hands, massage the spice rub into the meat; allow to stand for 10 minutes.
3. Grill the chops over indirect heat until no longer pink inside, about 12 minutes per side. An instant-read thermometer should read at least 145 degrees F (63 degrees C). Allow chops to stand for 10 more minutes before serving.
